

Your WordPress 'theme' determines the appearance - colors, fonts, some layout - of your blog.



This is the sidebar of our blog, showing examples of widgets that are available to you.





- Let's set up three common widgets: Search, email update subscription form, and RSS links



One more quick setting you might want to configure: your 'sharing' links, so that people can spread the word about your posts and your blog.

Go to the 'Settings' tab at the very bottom of the left hand sidebar, open it and click on 'Sharing'.

Add a share button from the options at the bottom of the page: you can help readers share on twitter, facebook, reddit, etc.

#### Domains:

You may want to register your own domain name.

You register it with a registrar, and then point it at a website.

You can register with WordPress.com or almost any web service provider.

Mapping is if you have previously purchased your domain name.

You may want to get rid of ads on your site.

Note that you can't run ads of your own, so you would have to switch back to WordPress.org if you want to generate revenue.


CSS is the coding language used to determine how your blog looks. It stands for Cascading Style Sheets.

If you want to make big changes to your blog's design, you will have to upgrade your blog to include the ability to edit CSS.
